



Make your own Mountain Range

Glen Coe's mountains have become an iconic part of Scotland's landscape. Getting outside and being amongst nature has increased in popularity recently. It has benefits for our own health, but we also need to pay attention to the environment and help protect it.



Why not try making your own Glen Coe mountain range from recyclable materials around your own home?

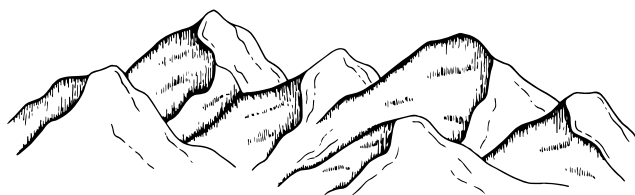
You can use the Three Sisters found in the heart of Glen Coe, The Pap which can be seen from the Museum, or use any other hills/mountains that you know of next to you.

What you will need:

- Cardboard (cereal boxes, boxes, packaging)
- Scissors
- Newspaper/scrap paper
- Glue
- Pencils/pens (colours)

Instructions:

- Take your cardboard, then draw on your chosen mountain range shape with your pen.
- Scrunch some newspaper into a ball, this will be the mountains snow, and use glue to stick this on the top of your mountains. (You can also use the scrap paper from cutting out the museum cottage on page three for the mountain snow!)
- Add any details you wish, print out our museum and stick it at the bottom of the mountain or any other building/thing you wish!
- Add any trees, animals or a road like the A82 that goes through Glen Coe.
- Now you have your very own eco-friendly mountain range!
